This sparked the attention of many MGS participants, as they awaited the arrival of Mr. Holden.

Not only did Mr. Holden serve as an ambassador and a role model for the citizens in Missouri, he is also

the cousin of Girls State Director Natalie Riley.

“I looked forward to hearing from Mr. Holden,” said Soo Yang, of Linn City, Price County. “Even though it’s important for us to experience leadership ourselves, we are greatly inspired by others of such high standards when they speak to us.”

Mr. Holden did more than share his experiences; he motivated the delegates to serve.

An interesting experience took place behind the doors of the Media/

Communication class today. Over 100 delegates who attended the class this morning admitted to being killers, human killers that is.

Dr. Michael Grinfeld PhD, of University of Missouri - Columbia, who is teaching the journalism class this year, asked the question, "Who here is a human killer?"

The room remained motionless and silent until Dr. Grinfeld raised his hand and told the class that he himself, was in fact, a killer.

At first, a sense

of shock and caution ran through the audience. Dr. Grinfeld then began to tell a story to his students what he meant, by elaborating on his question.

Dr. Grinfeld, who has two daughters, told the class that if someone tried to harm his two girls, he would shoot them without thinking twice. He continued explaining to the class that he probably wouldn't feel bad about it either.

After his explanation, he asked the students again, "Now, who in here is a killer?" Nearly every-

one in the class raised their hand.

Dr. Grinfeld related this story to an example by blowing a story quote "way-out-of-proportion." The class also learned the principles of journalism, the elements of relevance, usefulness, interest, and the stages of conflict.

The students were also able to enjoy a soda while they watched a clip created by the professor, which completed a successful first day of classes.

-Today, President Obama signed an Anti-Smoking Bill called the Family Smoking Prevention and Tobacco Control Act. This law will allow the FDA to regulate the contents and ingredients of tobacco products.
